

CONCLUSIONS

1

Challenges in accessing and fully participating in their English language education. Despite some efforts by lecturers to make materials accessible, the adaptations remained limited, hindering their active engagement and potentially leading to information gaps.

2

Lack of adequate adaptations in teaching methodologies, indicating a need for more comprehensive and inclusive approaches to cater to the diverse needs of visually impaired learners.
